
Can We Play Now?

We are staying home to help everyone be healthy.




I am not sick. My friends and my teachers are not sick. The grown-ups in my house are not sick, either.




I like playing with my friends and teachers at school. I wish I could play with them now.




My school is closed, but I can play with my toys at home!

My grown-ups say they can't play all day. They have to do their work.




When my school is not closed, my grown-ups go to work while I go to school.




Right now, their work is closed just like my school is closed! They are helping to make sure people stay healthy, too.




When my school is closed, I can play at home. When my grown-ups' work is closed, they need to do their work at home.




Sometimes I have to be extra quiet while they do their work. That is not so easy!




Sometimes I ask, "Can we play now?" But the grown-ups are busy with their work.




I have an idea! There are lots of things I know how to do without my grown-ups! I can play with my toys, read a book, dance, sing, jump, or build a tower!




My grown-ups will tell me when they can take a break from their work and play with me. I will try to be patient.
